

### **Instructions and hints for exhibitors**

Exhibitors must provide suitable plant saucers for each pot/bowl they are exhibiting.

Bulbs or plants must have been grown in the pot or bowl exhibited.

Pot plants must have been in the exhibitor's possession for a minimum of twelve months.

Remember that cut flowers may continue to grow after cutting.

Daffodils: the trumpet should be as long as, or longer than, the outer petals.

Narcissi: the cups should be shorter than the length of the outer petals.

Class 10: Primroses – one stem with one flower.

Class 11: Polyanthus – one stem with several flowers.

**Check that you have read the schedule correctly and that your entries conform to listed requirements.**

Personal entries must be registered at East Stour Village Hall on Friday, evening 20th March 2026 between 6.00pm and 7.00pm, and presented for display on Saturday morning, 21st March between 9.00am and 10.30am. **Entries will not be accepted for display after 10.30am on the Saturday morning.**

### **Presentation is everything!**

Remember to dead head exhibits and remove dead or damaged leaves. Vases of flowers need to be cut to the same length.

## Schedule of classes – Adult Section

- 1 Pot or bowl of bulbs in any condition (bulbs supplied last Autumn)
- 2 Pot or bowl of 5 growing daffodils or 5 grown narcissi
- 3 Pot or bowl of 5 growing miniature daffodils or 5 growing miniature narcissi
- 4 Pot or bowl of any other growing Spring bulbs – mixed or one type
- 5 Vase of 5 narcissi of the same variety
- 6 Vase of 5 daffodils of the same variety
- 7 Vase of 5 mixed narcissi and/or daffodils
- 8 Vase of 5 miniature narcissi or daffodils of the same variety
- 9 Vase of 5 tulips of the same variety
- 10 Vase of primroses (number optional)
- 11 Vase of polyanthus (number optional)
- 12 Vase of any other Spring flowers excluding Classes 1-11 but may include garden rogues, i.e. wild flowers and weeds from your garden (number optional)
- 13 Vase of blossoms/blooms from flowering shrubs/trees (number optional)
- 14 Miniature arrangement of Spring flowers not exceeding 4" overall (may include any of the above)
- 15 Petite arrangement of Spring flowers not exceeding 9" overall (may include any of the above)
- 16 Spring flower arrangement for the table (viewed all round and may include any of the above)
- 17 An arrangement of yellow and white flowers (may include any of the above)
- 18 Pot plant – flowering, excluding Orchids (any size)
- 19 Pot plant – Orchid (any size)
- 20 Pot plant – foliage (any size)
- 21 Succulent or Cactus (any size)
